# Knowing What to Revise

- Where to find out what to revise:
  1. Has your subject teacher given you a list of topic headings that you could use?
  2. Have you marked the sections you are studying in your revision guide?
  3. Have you got a complete set of revision hand-outs for each subject that provides them?
  4. Are your own notes up to date?
- Choosing a topic:
  1. Be REALLY specific! (eg Henry VIII: Thomas Wolsey and finance)
  2. Start with the stuff you find hardest (sorry).
  3. Just revise what you did two lessons ago.

# Prioritising your Work

- The process by which we determine the order for dealing with a series of tasks according to their relative importance.
- In other words; what should I do first and why.

Think about:

- 1) What is most urgent.
- 2) What I need to do.
- 3) What I want to do.

# Finding the Time

**8** = the number of subjects you should be revising.

**9** = if you are a scholar.

**25** = the number of minutes you should spend on each subject per week.

**3h 20m** = (3h 45m if you're a scholar) The number of hours you should spend in total **per week** on revision (not including the regular testing in languages)
