- 2. INSET Training- additional training will be given in January 2021 where necessary
- 6. and 7. All staff now wear masks moving around the site or where they cannot maintain SD between themselves and pupils.
- 8. All peripatetic staff now wear masks when moving around the school site and where they cannot maintain SD between themselves other staff and pupils.
- 9. All Admin staff will wear masks when moving around the school. All visitors to the school, including parents, are to wear masks whilst on site.
- 10. All staff to wear mask where they cannot maintain SD from other staff or pupils for example in the dining hall.
- 12, 13 and 14. Large gatherings which cannot be avoided, such as the Remembrance Service, will be held outside where bubbles and SD can be maintained.
