Maths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Addition and subtraction within 100/1000 (with and without exchanging and bridging) Numbers concepts to 1000/10,000 Multiplication and Division processes and facts within the 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 times tables. problem solving Telling the time Money- values to £2, addition totals and change
English	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Spelling - common words, spelling patterns and rules. Nussy Grammar – punctuation; nouns, proper nouns, verbs, adverbs, adjectives and alphabetical order Handwriting – working on joint handwriting, sizing and work on uniformity Writing – adventure stories (plot, character description and setting), research skills on topic; personal reports, book reports, diary writing Reading and comprehension work

Art	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The children will be introduced to the work of British Artist, David Hockney and will explore drawing and painting brightly coloured landscapes and portraits. Pattern and mark making will feature in these works alongside using oil pastels and watercolour paints.

Music	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The children will participate in action songs to improve listening, coordination, pitch and rhythm The children will complete simplified notation exercises to practice the rudiments of pitch and rhythm The children will continue to learn to play simple tunes on the recorder using Recorder Magic and other resources
French	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> revision (Reconnecting with language covered last term) Classroom instructions - numbers up to 30 - days/months - Body parts weather my Family / character description Free time activities - learning verbs to play/ to watch/ to listen / to do. Easter traditions in France
